



Who is Qualified?

Assuming the disease process follows its normal course, any person certified by their attending physician to have a life expectancy of six months or less.

Will There be a New Physician?

In addition to the support of the Lexington Hospice team's physician, we will coordinate with your Primary Care Physician for the best continuation of care possible.

Where is Hospice Provided?

Hospice provides services that promote the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of the patient and family in the patient's home, wherever that may be. We also provide short-term inpatient care in skilled-nursing facilities for pain and symptoms that are difficult to manage at home.

How is Hospice Paid for?

Hospice services are covered through Medicare and Medicaid Hospice Benefits. In addition, we also work with each patient to maximize the value of any Private Insurance they may have in place.
